Good News: Phase 2 of Toro Coast Preserve Almost Done!

Thanks to all of you who have contributed to the Toro Coast Preserve (TCP) conservation effort! You have helped us fulfill our mission to preserve open space.

With your contributions and contributions from our allied organizations as well, we have the funds we need to close on the Phase 2 portion. This is a huge achievement that I hope all of you are proud to be part of. It means that $\frac{2}{3}$ of the TCP project is effectively done.


Now we can move on to Phase 3, the final phase of the project, to acquire the Shore Plant, access road, and portions of the property where the old tank farm was. This will complete the acquisition needed for SLO County Parks to set up a publicly accessible park in perpetuity.

If there are any contributions in excess of what is needed to complete Phase 2, it will be held securely to be put toward Phase 3.

When will Phase 2 acquisition be done?

The plan was to close the Phase 2 portion of the project at the Wildlife Conservation Board meeting in August. All of the requirements for closing—including funds in hand— have been met by us, with the Land Conservancy of SLO County taking the lead. However, the WCB has had to move that action out a little, so the actual closing and acquisition of the property should happen in November.

When the final documents are signed, the actual owner will be SLO County Parks. This is a very good thing because it means the land will be under active, experienced management from the start, and we'll be one more step toward the park.



When will we be able to access Phase 2 land?

I know lots of you are eager to walk, bike or hike the land in Phase 2 along Alva Paul Creek. We do not know exactly when County Parks will be able to open the property to users, but their outright ownership of it means that it is a possibility that portions along the creek could be prepared for use before Phase 3 is completed. Whether County Parks decides to begin work on Phase 2 land early is unknown, but we will be watching it carefully and will let you know.

If there are opportunities for you to participate in the process, we will let you know about that, too.

Oso Flaco Field Trip

On June 12 several MBOSA members were treated to a tour of Oso Flaco Lake led by State Park volunteers Cheryl Powers and Sally Krenn. It's quite a drive to reach the lake but one that is worth it! Last season's rains produced major overgrowth of the plants in the area leading out to the lake and there were plenty of new ones in bloom to identify.
